The purpose of this file is to see if punctuation which might be used in Traditional Chinese is present in a font.

Here I am showing WenQuanYi Zen Hei (a Simplified Chinese font) wich is the first preference for both Sans and Serif for fontconfig in a TW system. Note that no other Sans fonts are preferred by fontconfig in a TW system, but local rules can override the preference.

For Serif the remaining preference in a TW system are AR PL New Sung (Simplified Chinese) and AR PL Mingti2L Big5.

Although Chinese can use a wave dash to indicate numeric ranges, the full-width tilde (usually in a very curly form) is used for that, no free Chinese fonts other than Source Han (Noto), derivatives of those, and WenQuanYi Zen Hei support the U+301C codepoint. Similarly, although some online text claims that the two-em dash, U+2E3A, is preferred in Chinese only the Source Han (Noto) fonts and their derivatives support it and it seems unlikely that any online Chinese text will use it.

For Sans in a TW system the remaining preferences are AR PL New Sung, AR PL KaitiM Big5 and AR PL Mingti2L Big5.

AR PL ZenKai Uni is listed as a preference for Sans in fontconfig after the above, but the family was renamed back to its original name (AR PL UKai)" to avoid confusion" (!) and fontconfig was not updated.

The only libre Traditional Chinese Sans font with mid-level ellipses that I know of is Glow Sans TC.
