FandolSong (FandolSong-Regular.otf v0.3 2015-07-18)

This Serif font covers English, Simplified Chinese and Yi. Although it has glyphs for Russian, they are too widely-spaced to be usable. The Greek letters do not include accented letters. It does not support Korean Hanjul and has incomplete support for Japanese and Traditional Chinese (specifically, insufficient to show my Article 1 examples).

It has a few accented Latin letters needed to show the tones in Pinyin (汉语拼音方案 in Simplified).

For languages not using Latin, Cyrillic or Greek alphabets I merely display the digits, if not common 0..9, and Article 1 of the UDHR.
