This persian font covers English, Arabic and Farsi. For variations of the latin, cyrillic, and greek alphabets I attempt to show the whole alphabet, followed by Article 1 of the UDHR (it is traditional!). For the other scripts and languages I merely display the digits (if not common 0..9) and Article 1.
